Dr Siddaway is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Expert Witness specialising in trauma, adversity, stress, medical psychology (e.g., chronic pain), and clinical risk. He chairs the British Psychological Society's Expert Witness Advisory Group, which advises on professional standards and good practice for psychologists working in the legal arena. He prepares approximately 100 medico-legal reports per year (65% claimant, 25% defendant, 10% joint) for cases involving adults, adolescents, and children. He is primarily instructed in personal injury (fast track, intermediate, and multi-track proceedings) and clinical negligence cases, providing expert opinion on psychological injury, condition, causation, prognosis, functional impact, disability, and treatment recommendations. He also accepts instructions in immigration, employment, and child/family proceedings. Dr Siddaway has extensive experience in medico-legal assessment and provides clear, accessible reports and oral evidence in accordance with CPR Part 35. His professional opinions are impartial, balanced, and evidence-based. Assessments adopt a structured forensic approach, involving detailed clinical interview, mental state examination, behavioural observation, review of relevant records and collateral information, and psychometric and symptom validity testing where appropriate. Opinions are formed based on the totality of available information, with careful consideration of internal and external consistency, response bias, alternative explanations, and clinical plausibility.

Dr Siddaway conducts and supervises research alongside NHS clinical practice and expert witness work. He has published ~20 articles on a range of clinical topics, many of which are on trauma/adversity and clinical risk. A complete list of his publications can be found at his website (andysiddaway.com). His publications have been cited ~6,000 times to date. He supervises Doctoral and MSc students, has been invited to grant review for the ESRC and act as external PhD examiner, and has provided hundreds of peer-reviews for ~60 journals, including top-tier journals such as *American Psychologist*, *PNAS*, and *The Lancet Psychiatry*. Dr Siddaway's research and clinical expertise in the field of trauma was recognised by two successive appointments to the

Editorial Advisory Board of the *Journal of Traumatic Stress* (2017-2023). His expertise is respected by Clinical and Counselling Psychologists, Psychiatrists, and legal professionals and he was invited to write a best practice guide on assessing and diagnosing posttraumatic stress disorder for medico-legal and other clinical purposes for *BJPsych Advances*, the Royal College of Psychiatrists' continuing professional development journal for psychiatrists. He teaches and delivers training in clinical and academic settings and presents educational lectures on different aspects of expert witness work to other mental health experts and legal professionals.
