Dr Siddaway is Registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC); Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer at the University of Glasgow; Associate Fellow of the British Psychological Society (BPS); and Chair of the BPS' Expert Witness Advisory Group, which advises on professional standards and good practice for psychologists working as expert witnesses. He has two decades of clinical experience and has specialised in working with trauma- and adversity-related mental health problems and clinical risk since 2012, including working in an Occupational Health service, and in services for traumatically bereaved children, adult amputees, veterans, and with a wide range of trauma-exposed populations in the largest psychological trauma service in the UK. He combines NHS clinical practice with expert witness work and conducting and supervising research and works across the lifespan – with children, adolescents, and adults. He is a trusted expert witness for personal injury, clinical negligence, family law, immigration, and employment cases, and is instructed by claimants, defendants, and as a single joint expert. Known for producing meticulous, rigorous, accessible reports, he delivers high-quality assessments that meet the demands of complex legal cases.

Regulated professionals must comply with the HCPC's standards of conduct, performance and ethics.
- **Chartered by The British Psychological Society (BPS)** (169463). A legally recognised title that reflects the highest standard of psychological knowledge and expertise. Chartered members of the BPS must comply with BPS codes of conduct and member conduct rules.
- **Use of the title 'Consultant'** reflects seniority and specialist knowledge, competencies, and experience. The interview panels for my NHS Consultant Clinical Psychologist roles included BPS National Assessors, who provide independent guidance on appointments at Consultant level.

EXPERT WITNESS AREAS OF EXPERTISE

- **Personal injury/clinical negligence:** psychiatric/psychological injuries and complex mental health problems following accidents (e.g., road traffic or workplace accidents) and breach of duty/negligence, including serious and catastrophic injury, historical abuse, discrimination, military claims, victims of crime and abuse
- **Family law:** mental health of children and parents, parenting competence, family functioning, sibling and parent relationships, complex systemic dynamics, risk to children, residency, contact, ability to make and sustain changes, parental alienation
- **Risk assessment and management:** suicide risk, sexual recidivism, sexually harmful behaviour, domestic abuse, intimate partner violence. Theory and evidence-based risk assessment and management, including capacity and motivation to change, protective factors, recommendations for management/treatment
- **Employment:** work-related stress, fitness to work, return to work, employment tribunals, psychiatric injury, bullying, harassment, discrimination

- **Immigration/asylum:** victims of torture and abuse, including human trafficking, deportation and its impact on couples and families, risk assessment

Expert assessments entail one or more of the following approaches:

- **Clinical interview:** detailed assessments of complex mental health problems/disorders
- **Diagnosis of psychiatric disorders and personality disorders using DSM-5-TR and ICD-11**
- **Psychometric/psychological testing**
- **Psychological formulation:** used to describe and explain mental health problems/disorders, anticipate and overcome barriers to change (relevant to judgments about prognosis), and guide individualised treatment plans and evidence-based interventions. Formulation uses psychological theory and evidence to explain complex mental health problems/disorders, including why a specific individual developed particular mental health problems/injuries when they did, how mental and physical health problems inter-relate, the contributing role of social factors, and problematic systemic relationships.

Dr Siddaway has published ~20 articles on a range of clinical topics, many of which are on trauma/adversity and clinical risk. He supervises Doctoral and Masters students, has been invited to grant review for the ESRC and act as external PhD examiner, and has provided hundreds of peer-reviews for ~60 journals, including top-tier journals such as *American Psychologist*, *PNAS*, and *The Lancet Psychiatry*. Dr Siddaway's research and clinical expertise in the field of trauma was recognised by two successive appointments to the Editorial Advisory Board of the *Journal of Traumatic Stress* (2017-2023). His expertise is respected and valued by Psychiatrists and legal professionals and he was recently invited to write a best practice guide on assessing and diagnosing posttraumatic stress disorder for medico-legal and other clinical purposes for *BJPsych Advances*, the Royal College of Psychiatrists' continuing professional development journal for psychiatrists. He teaches and delivers training in clinical and academic settings and sometimes presents educational lectures on different aspects of expert witness work to psychiatrists and legal professionals.
