Dr Siddaway is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Expert Witness. He has over two decades of clinical experience and has specialised in mental health problems and disorders arising from trauma, injury, adversity, stress, and long-term medical conditions (e.g., chronic pain), and risk assessment, since 2012. He chairs the British Psychological Society's Expert Witness Advisory Group, which advises on professional standards and good practice for psychologists working in the legal arena. He prepares approximately 100 medico-legal reports per year (55% claimant, 40% defendant, 5% SJE) for cases involving adults, adolescents, and children. He is regularly instructed in complex and high-value personal injury and clinical negligence claims, providing expert opinion on psychological injury (including diagnosis), consistency and reliability of presentation, causation, prognosis, treatment needs, and functional impact (including disability). He also accepts instructions in immigration, employment, and child/family proceedings, and Fast Track and Intermediate Track personal injury claims. He provides clear, well-reasoned, accessible reports and oral evidence in accordance with CPR Part 35, and his opinions are independent, balanced, and evidence-based. Assessments follow a structured, forensic methodology: detailed clinical interview, mental state examination, behavioural observation, review of records and collateral information, and psychometric assessment and symptom validity testing where appropriate. Opinions are based on the totality of available information, with careful consideration of internal and external consistency, response bias, clinical plausibility, and alternative explanations.

Opinion on consistency and reliability of presentation, causation, prognosis, treatment needs, and functional impact (including disability).

Theory- and evidence-based risk assessment, formulation, and management, including protective factors, capacity and motivation to change, and treatment recommendations.

CLINICAL RESEARCH & TEACHING

Dr Siddaway is an Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer at the University of Glasgow and West Node Lead for the NHS Research Scotland Mental Health Network. His PhD, funded by a competitive Medical Research Council Clinical Research Training Fellowship, focused on risk and psychometric assessment. He has published over 20 peer-reviewed articles, many on trauma/adversity and clinical risk (full list at andysiddaway.com), and his work has been cited approximately 6,800 times (h-index: 15). He supervises Doctoral and MSc students, acts as external PhD examiner, and has provided hundreds of peer-reviews for ~60 journals, including *American Psychologist*, *PNAS*, *The Lancet Psychiatry*, and *Psychological Injury and Law*. Dr Siddaway's research and clinical expertise in the field of trauma was recognised by two successive appointments to the Editorial Advisory Board of the *Journal of Traumatic Stress* (2017-2023). His expertise is respected by Clinical and Counselling Psychologists, Psychiatrists, and legal professionals and he was invited to write a best practice guide on assessing and diagnosing posttraumatic stress disorder for medico-legal and other clinical purposes for *BJPsych Advances*, the Royal College of Psychiatrists' continuing professional development journal for psychiatrists. He teaches and delivers training in clinical and academic settings and presents educational lectures on expert witness work to mental health experts and legal professionals.
